



## Development Campaign News, October 2011

Are you wondering what's going on behind the scenes with the Development Campaign (previously known as the Building Project)? Well, here's the latest news at the end of October 2011.

- The Organ**      The Diocese has now formally approved the removal of the organ and we have a buyer (a church in Germany). The organ will be dismantled during the week beginning 28<sup>th</sup> November. Matthew is the main person dealing with this.
- The Roof**        Michael is the main person dealing with the roof and he is currently in discussions with our architect about getting specifications for the works drawn up and so on. The PCC will be discussing this at its November meeting.
- The Heating**    We are waiting for the final formal approval for the heating installation from the diocese. We hope to receive this late November or early December. Due to the lead times involved, the installation will not take place until after Christmas. Mick is the person to talk to about the heating.
- Toilets**          The PCC has agreed some revised plans and we are now seeking quotes for the work. Gail is the main contact.
- The Rest...**    After the above priorities we will be looking at the next stages which will include a prayer room, the reordering of the nave floor including swapping the pews for chairs and a number of other items. It is likely that a further small group of people will be drawn together to address this.

We are very grateful to the Coffee Tavern Trust which has made two grants; one covering the entire cost of the initial heating works and a second towards the roofing works. The fund-raising group comprising Julie, Rosie and Gail continues to investigate a wide range of sources of funding.

Your prayers for all aspects of the Building Project would, of course, be appreciated.
